
NVCA's Partnershipwith the Township of Amaranth

The Nottawasaga Valley Conservation Authority (NVCA) works with municipalities, partners, funders, landowners, and volunteers to manage the watershed so that it is resilient to flood, erosion, climate change, and urban growth.

NVCA's watershed science work in Amaranth supports the health of the Nottawasaga River's headwaters and cold water streams. By collecting information from rivers, streams, groundwater, wetlands, and forests in the Nottawasaga Watershed, NVCA measures the effectiveness of environmental restoration projects, the impacts of new development, or other changes influencing the Upper Nottawasaga River and Boyne River Subwatersheds

NVCA also works with many partners such as the Dufferin Rural Water Quality Program, Dufferin Federal Agricultural Committee and Ontario Soil Crop Improvement Association to strengthen food security in the region and beyond. This work includes restoring rivers, streams, wetlands, grasslands and forests to improve water quality, increase wildlife habitat and sequester carbon.
